<p>Identify correctly the concepts and vocabulary of the field of psychology.</p> <p>Copied and pasted from the syllabus, or created with the 8 abilities and program/division /degree outcomes in mind.</p>	<p>MSU – Great Falls CORE/Social Sciences</p> <p>Demonstrate knowledge of findings and theories in the social and behavioral sciences.</p> <p>First, know which your course/field of study falls under. Then, grab a catalog (available online from the msugf webpage) and look up the program area or division to find the listed outcomes.</p> <p>Business, Trades and Technology and Health Sciences courses usually fall under a program. Arts and Sciences core courses tend to fall under the General Education Core, although some are related instruction. Outreach courses directly meet the mission of Outreach and workforce Development (now Extended Learning).</p> <p>Then, pick which outcome this objective helps to meet and list it here.</p> <p>If you are unsure of where your course falls, contact your Division for more information.</p>	<p>Introductory</p> <p>Select the best of the three, according to the description. Use the descriptive words in your objectives to help pick this type. In the example the word "identify" fits this type. You may find that you need to modify some language in your objectives.</p>	<p>This objective will be assessed through several measures:</p> <p>Online discussions Chapter tests 1-14 (all questions) Student research project</p> <p>Looked in the syllabus to see what assignments students have to complete and which ones provide assessment of the listed objective. These assignments may also measure other objectives as well. When planning objectives or new assignments, make sure that each assignment matches at least one objective and that each objective is measured through an assignment or activity.</p>
